"It felt good to win and it is a great confidence booster for me. My short game and my putting really helped me," Noibanchong added.
In other girls' competition, New Orleans' Karrington Knight (47) captured the 12-13 year-old category defeating New Orleans' Camille Simon (51). Other local players included: Slidell's Catherine Landry (60) and Slidell's Josie Headrick (64).
In the girls 14-15 age group, Harvey's Angelica Harris (75) edged Abita Springs' Savannah Ennis (77) in a competitive match, while Madisonville's Michaela Bryan (98) finished in third place.

In the boys' action, Metairie's Jay Rowell (39) won the boys' 9-11 age category as he defeated Mandeville's Chris Wilson (45) followed by Marrero's Damon Gibson (46). Other local finishers included: Slidell's Bryce Denley (60) and Mandeville's Joshua Rumsey (66).

Turning to the boys' 12-13 age group, Ponchatoula's Justin Caldwell (78) edged Covington's Raymond Poche (80) followed by Larose's Kyle Estay (80). Other local competitors included: Slidell's Zachary Barrios (91), Madisonville's Chase Noel (94), Covington's Tanner Ledet (95) and Slidell's Logan Kastner (102).
