

LSU golfer Myles Lewis qualifies for U.S. Amateur **By Trey Iles, The Times-Picayune**

LSU golfer Myles Lewis, who played at Jesuit, qualified for the U.S. Amateur on Monday with a 36-hole total 8-under score of 136 at Money Hill Golf and Country Club.

Lewis, the fifth LSU golfer to earn a trip to the U.S. Amateur this summer, finished second, one stroke behind Southeastern Louisiana University golfer Grady Brame, from Hammond. The two were the only qualifiers from the Money Hill sectional, that had 48 golfers in the field.

"I played great, hit the ball fantastic," Lewis said. "I didn't get in any trouble and had three bogeys in 36 holes. I guess the big thing was I made putts." The U.S. Amateur will be played Aug. 13-19 at Cherry Hills Country Club near Denver.

Lewis will be a sophomore at LSU this school year. He captured three Division I state high school championships at Jesuit.
